

LJB's Cookin' Corner KING CAKE BUBBLE UP

LOYD'S NOTE: As we've mentioned before, Sophie loves to bake and recently tried this recipe to ring in the Mardi Gras season. Everyone enjoyed it so much that she made it again the very next weekend. There may not be parades, but we can all still enjoy the season.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 (I2.4-oz) cans refrigerated cinnamon rolls (not Grands, they will be too thick)
- I (8oz) pack cream cheese, softened
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- · I tsp vanilla
- I cup milk
- Purple, green and yellow decorating sugar or sprinkles

DIRECTIONS

- I. Preheat oven to 375°F.
- 2. Lightly spray a 9x13-inch pan with baking spray.
- Separate cinnamon rolls. (Save icing to use after the bubble up is baked.) Cut each cinnamon roll into four pieces and place in bottom on prepared pan.
- 4. Using a hand-held electric mixer, beat together cream cheese and



sugar. (Make sure the cream cheese has softened. On our first try, we had not let the cream cheese soften long enough and it didn't blend well.)

- 5. Add eggs and vanilla to cream cheese, mixing well.
- 6. Add milk and mix until combined.
- 7. Pour over chopped cinnamon rolls.
- 8. Bake for 30 to 35 minutes. Remove from oven and cool for 5 to 10 minutes.

- 9. Spread cinnamon roll icing over top of casserole.
- 10. Sprinkle with colored sugar.
